Here is an announcement of utmost importance to every police communication officer who has the interest of his department in his mind: THERE WILL BE A CONVENTION OF POLICE COMMUNICATION OFFICERS AT INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA, OCTOBER 7-10, 1935, INCLUSIVE.

1. Time: - 10:00 o'clock A.M.
MONDAY, OCTOBER 7th.
2. Dates - October 7-8-9-10.
3. City - Indianapolis, Ind.
4. Place - Hotel Severin.
5. Registration fees (non-members) \$2.00.
6. Registration fees (members) \$0.00.
7. Hotel rates: - single - \$2.50 double- \$3.50
all outside rooms, which usually run \$4.00 - \$6.00.
8. Ladies: - If accompanying members, ladies *free*,
accompanying non-members, registration fee of \$3.00 will include both persons.
9. Banquet: - No charges for banquet, to registered delegates. Others, \$2.00.
10. Displays: - Twenty booths of commercial apparatus covering the entire communication field. Transmitters, ultra-high and conventional frequencies, Receivers. Automotive generators. "B" supplies. Talk-back equipment. Telephone apparatus, in fact everything is being done to make your trip instructive and worth while.

An excellent program is being arranged and will be forwarded a few days prior to the convention. We are arranging for technical talks and demonstrations by well-known engineers, and we expect representatives of the International Association of Chiefs of Police, Federal Communications Commission and U.S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Investigation, to attend.

We hope to bring to a satisfactory conclusion, all details regarding inter-city communication, and many other questions have arisen which involve not only A.P.C.O. members, but all communication systems as well. It will be to your interest and the interest of your department, to attend this convention.

Enclosed you will find an application blank and a card. All communication officers who are paid as such, by city, county or state, are invited to become members of the APCO. There are no initiation fees and membership dues are \$2.50 per year. Simply fill in the application blank, attach your check or money order and mail it to us.

Every officer, whether active or associate member, or non-member, who plans on attending the convention, is requested to fill in the enclosed card and deposit it in a mail box. The hotel people and others concerned, are anxious to know the approximate attendance, so that full arrangements can be made. Please do this NOW.

The International Association of Chiefs of Police, during the July, 1935 convention at Atlantic City, N.J., adopted a resolution OFFICIALLY RECOGNIZING THE A.P.C.O. and encouraging it in its work. There is no other National organization of Communication Officers. Therefore, if you are engaged in police communication work, and are at all interested in cooperating with others in the same field, you belong in the APCO and we shall be glad to receive your application.

The displays will be interesting not only to APCO members but to Chiefs and other police officials as well, and especially to those who contemplate equipping departments with radio, alarm or call box systems. Every one is welcome to inspect this equipment and representatives will be on hand at all times to explain.

We urge members to bring with them, any equipment which you think will be of interest to communication officers. There will be space and time allotments for any demonstrations, and your apparatus, if you do not care for public demonstrations, may be demonstrated only to APCO members, in a special room to be provided.
